AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

CASE NO: KK3 777B

AUTOPSY DATE: 26.08.99

MORTUARY: Visoko

SUMMARY:

A complete and largely intact body, with most of the skin and soft tissues remaining and partial skeletonization only of the forearms and hands. Many of the internal organs were still present.

The person was male, and as established from anthropology data was aged between 31 and 65, and measured from 166 to 181 cms in height. He appeared to be of average build but, apart from having a stubbly beard at the time of his death, there were no particular identifying features.

He died from a gunshot injury to the head, the bullet fragmenting the front part of the skull and the face and producing fractures running up into the vault. The core of the bullet was lying inside the brain.

The only other injuries were fractures of nearly all of the ribs on both sides of the chest, and of the left side of the pelvis, almost certainly from crushing or moving the body after death.

There were no other significant findings.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 777B was:

Gunshot injury to head
