SUMMARY:

Numerous assorted bones – pieces of skull and lower jaw, a single bone from the neck, and bones from the chest, left forearm and both hands. They appeared to be from at least two separate individuals.

From anthropology examination, both individuals were adults but it was not possible to say whether male or female or to determine anything further.

The skull was clearly fractured but what caused this or whether it occurred before or after death is impossible to say. The single rib present was also fractured, most likely post mortem.

There were no other findings and from this examination it is not possible to determine the cause of death in these persons.

Unascertained
