## **AUTOPSY REPORT**

## SUMMARY:

These partially skeletonized, saponified remains were found to contain a cloth band consistent with a ligature of the wrist.

Anthropological data established the person as a man, 31 to 60 years of age and about 172 cm in stature. Upper and lower complete dental plates were in place. There was a healed fracture of the right 1<sup>st</sup> rib. There was light brown hair. No other identifying features were discovered.

Autopsy revealed a gunshot wound of the pelvis which passed from front to back and would have passed through tissues containing large blood vessels.

There were also gunshot wounds of the right arm and right leg, the latter from front to back. There was a possible gunshot injury to the left leg.

In addition, multiple bilateral rib fractures indicated crushing of the body after death.

## CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 831B was:

Gunshot wound of the pelvic region
