AUTOPSY REPORT
KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

SUMMARY:

The remains of this man were received intact but distorted.

Anthropological data established him to be 31 to 60 years of age and to have a stature of about 172 cm. There was dark brown hair, but no other identifying features were seen.

Autopsy revealed a gunshot wound of the right femur, which although it might have caused death, would not be expected to kill in less than twenty minutes. Therefore the actual cause of death is likely to be a gunshot to the chest or abdomen, even though I cannot conclude that with certainty, based on the anatomic data.

A fracture of the left radius may have been caused by a gunshot injury.

Fractures of the ribs, pelvis and right scapula indicates that there was extensive post mortem crushing of the remains.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 832B** was:
Unascertained
