## **AUTOPSY REPORT**

## SUMMARY:

Almost totally skeletonized human remains.

As established from anthropology data, the person was male, aged 31 - 60, and measured  $173.6 \ 7.7 + / - cms$  in stature. There was a gold tooth in maxilla; which could be a particular identifying feature of the individual.

A keyhole was found in left parietal bone as well as huge destruction of the base of skull and C1-C3 vertebras. These suggest that the cause of death was gunshot injury to the head. Furthermore some fragments of the bullet were found within the pelvis and right iliac bone was also fractured. These show that this individual was also shot in this area.

There were fractures of ribs and scapula. They may well have occurred post mortem from crushing, and/or moving the body.

## **CAUSE OF DEATH:**

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 833B was:

Gunshot injury to the head
