SUMMARY:

This was a partly skeletonized body from soft tissue of determination, it was a male one. According to anthropology estimations height was 175.5 + 1/- 7.7 cm and age range 31 - 71 years.

Hair was brown. Body was complete. Both arms were ligated and there was also a blindfold.

In the head and neck areas were bullet fragments. In the skull was a bullet entrance wound in left parietal bone back and entrance-exit wound in right occipital bone. In the right side of the skull and facial region a part of bones was missing. Findings show that the direction of the shot was from back to front.

There were also splinter fractures in right arms and leg and also possible bullet fragments in the same areas. Fractures are probable, gunshot injuries.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 834B was:

Gunshot injuries on the head, and right arm and leg
