SUMMARY:

According to soft tissue and anthropology determination, it was a man. From anthropology determination the height estimate was 177.6 +/- 7.7 cm and age range 31 – 71 years. Body was almost complete. Both arms were in ligature. In mouth was a tooth prosthesis. This was a heavily saponified, partly skeletonized body.

Two splinter injury areas, which were gunshot injuries:

Fractures in the skull and facial bones. In right occipital bone probable entrance-exit wound. In left frontal bone a bone defect, probable exit wound, in diameter approximately 8-10 mm. Also right side of mandible was fractured. According to findings a shot was directed to parietal bone from back to front. There were also fractures in tibia and fibula. In the same areas were also fragments of bullets, so the fractures probably are gunshot injuries.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 835B** was: **Gunshot injury of the skull and left leg.**

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings
