SUMMARY:

A partly skeletonized body of a man, aged 31-65 years. Stature is 177.8 +/- 7.7 cms. Hair is black and short, and no teeth present. Bones were complete, except small bones of extremities. In addition there was one extra cranial fragment (occipital and right parietal portions) not associated with body.

In the skull were splitted fractures in both sides, but mostly in right back. The base of the skull was undamaged. In the right temporal area was an exit wound and probably entrance wound. The left ramus of mandible was absent and the trunk fractured. In fluoroscopy there were bullet fragments in the skull.

Also bone injuries, which would probably be ante mortem, could not be determined.

In the region of the legs were bullet fragments, but not bone injuries.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 853B** was:
Gunshot injury of the head

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.
