SUMMARY:

Almost complete human remains (minus distal parts of both bones of right forearm), mostly skeletonized with some greasy soft tissues elsewhere. Neither ligature nor blindfold was found.

As established from anthropology data this person was male, aged between 31 and 71 years, and measured 165.8 +/- 7.7 cms in height. There were no particular identifying features.

Multiple rib fractures may have occurred post mortem from moving or crushing the body. It is impossible to say which caused the fractures of right humerus, right forearm and left radius and whether they have occurred post or ante mortem.

A copper bullet was found in the soft tissues of right femur, but the bone around was intact. Furthermore, tiny metal fragment was found during the exhumation, on the skin of the torso. Another copper bullet was found in the soft tissues of right lower abdomen.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 862B was:

Gunshot injury to the trunk
