AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

SUMMARY:

Complete human remains, saponified. Neither ligature nor blindfold was found.

On external examination it was found that the person was male. As established from anthropology data he was aged between 31 and 65, and measured 176.4 +/- 7.7 cms in height. There were no particular identifying features.

The facial part of the skull and the skull base was squashed, but its nature suggests rather a lot of post mortem destruction. Some ribs were fractured, which may well have occurred post mortem by moving or crushing the body. One bullet was found in the soft tissues of the backside of the left femur, but the bone around was intact.

There were no other findings and so the cause of death in this person, from this examination, remains unascertained.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 866B** was:

Unascertained
