AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

SUMMARY:

Complete human remains, mostly skeletonized with some greasy soft tissue. No ligature was found. Blindfold was present.

As established from anthropology data, the person was male, aged between 31 and 60 years, and measured 172.3 +/-7.7 cms in height. There were no particular identifying features.

A multi-fragmented fracture of the skull with a hole in left parietal area was found. This hole has partially internal bevelling and partially external. Some radiating fractures are present as well as a huge fragmentation of the skull base. These are certainly suggestive of a high velocity rifle injury. Furthermore, large hole in right pelvis with internal bevelling was found and destroyed coin, jacket and two bullets were found deep in the soft tissues of lower abdomen. This is certainly suggestive of high velocity rifle injury (the bullet shot primarily the coin and secondly they both shot into the deep tissues of the abdomen).

Multiple rib fractures may well have occurred post mortem from moving or crushing the body. It is not possible however, to say what caused the left fibula fracture and whether it occurred post or ante mortem.

Finally, one bullet was found in the soft tissues of right shoulder and two in left femur, but the bones around were intact. Presumably those bullets had passed through something or someone else beforehand.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 877B was:

Gunshot injury to the head and trunk

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.
