AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

AUTOPSY DATE: 06.09.99

MORTUARY: Visoko

SUMMARY:

Complete human remains, almost complete, partly skeletonized. Neither ligature nor blindfold was found.

During x-ray, no metal parts were found. As established from anthropology data, the person was male, aged 31 to 65, and measured 169 +/- 7.7 cms in height. There were no particular identifying features.

Rib, pelvis, left scapula, left radius and right radius fractures were found. They may well have occurred post mortem from crushing and/or moving the body. Furthermore, multi-fragmented fractures of facial parts of the skull, mandible and right humerus were found. None of these fragments showed any clear bevelling and no metal fragments were seen, but the nature and extent of the damage was certainly suggestive of a high velocity rifle injury.

He died probably from a gunshot injury to the head.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 889B was:

Gunshot injury to the head
