AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

CASE NO: KK3 892B

AUTOPSY DATE: 25.08.99

MORTUARY: Visoko

SUMMARY:

A complete body except some phalanges of the right foot. The body was partly skeletonized, with most of the soft tissue attached and saponified. The body was partly clothed. Soft tissue external examination showed that the body was of a male.

From anthropology data the age was estimated to range between 31 - 60 and stature as 171.8 + 7.7 cm. There were no other specific identifying features.

There were multiple gunshot injuries to the chest, abdomen and pelvis as was shown by two skin entrance bullet wounds, the fractured bones of those areas, the recovered bullets and fragments from the body, and the radiological findings.

The skull fractures described in the report were most probably post mortem in nature.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 892B was:

Multiple gunshot injuries to the chest, abdomen and pelvis

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.
