AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

SUMMARY:

A complete body except for a few missing small bones of both hands. The body was intact and the soft tissue showed advanced decomposition changes. The body was partly clothed and blindfolded. An empty cartridge was found among the body clothing. Soft tissue examination revealed that the body was of a male.

From anthropology the age was estimated to range between 31 and 65 and the stature as 162.2 +/- 7.7 cm.

There were gunshot injuries to the chest and abdomen, as was shown radiologically and from the recovered bullets and fragments. In addition, there was another gunshot injury to the pelvic region, as shown by the entrance wound of the left hip region, the fractured bones of the pelvis, and the recovered bullet from the right side of the pelvis. The fragmented fractured bones of the right shoulder region indicated a gunshot injury of that area.

Other rib fractures of both sides were most probably post mortem in nature.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 895B was:

Multiple gunshot injuries of the right shoulder, chest, abdomen and pelvis

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.
