AUTOPSY REPORT

SUMMARY:

This was a partly skeletonized and saponified body of a man. According to the anthropology data his height was 167.6 +/- 7.7 cm, and age range 17 to 29 years. Hair on head and body was black.

In the left hip bone was a round hole, 3 cm in diameter, which looks old and unfit for gunshot injury. In the chest was a bullet and fragments. In the upper chest were fractures in spinal vertebrae, costae in right side, right clavicle and sternum suitable for gunshot injuries.

In addition, there was a bullet in femur region and splinter fractures in right hip bone. There were bullet fragments and fractures in right femur.

Two gunshot areas in chest and right leg, probably third in hip region.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 900B was:

Gunshot injuries in the chest and right leg

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.
