AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

SUMMARY:

Complete human remains, saponified. No blindfold was found. Both hands are tied up behind the back with a cloth ligature.

As established from anthropology data, the person was male, aged 31 – 65, measuring 183.4 +/- 7.7 cms in height. No further identifying features were found.

Copper bullet, found around the pelvis, was lying outside the body. Rib and pelvis fractures may well have occurred post mortem from moving or crushing the body, although some metal parts were found on x-ray in the chest. A hole, with internal bevelling and radiating fractures, was found in left parietal bone. Furthermore, a multi-fragmented fracture of the skull base and mandible was found. This suggests that the person was shot with a high velocity rifle bullet to the head.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 919B was:

Gunshot injury to the head
