## **AUTOPSY REPORT**

## SUMMARY:

These were partly skeletonized and saponified remains with no ligature and no blindfold.

Huge destruction of the skull suggests that the cause of death was gunshot injury to the head, although no bullet was found inside the head, but only outside. Furthermore, there was some evidence of gunshot injuries of the limbs (there were also several holes in the trousers that could be produced by bullets).

Anthropological examination shows that it was the remains of an adult male, aged 19 to 29, and about 182 cm in stature.

## **CAUSE OF DEATH:**

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 925B was:

Gunshot injury of the head

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.
