AUTOPSY REPORT

SUMMARY:

This was a partly skeletonized and saponified body. Body was complete: According to soft tissue determination the sex was male. From anthropology measurements the height estimate was 178.3 +/- 7.7 cm, and age range 31 to 65 years. He had black, short hair and a short beard. In teeth was caries.

He was wearing a waistcoat, long-sleeved shirt, trousers, long underpants, belt, socks and shoes. He has blindfold and two ligatures in hands.

In fluoroscopy bullet fragments were seen in the neck and right femur. Frontal two cervical vertebrae were broken. In back right parietal bones of the skull was an entrance-exit wound and fractures in all bones. Also there was a fracture in left side of mandible.

According to findings, the shooting was directed to the parietal area and from back to front, damaging cranial bones, also mandible and 1-2 cervical vertebrae.

There were bullet fragments in right leg and fractures in femurs.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 929B was:

Gunshot injury to the head and left leg
