AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

SUMMARY:

Complete human remains, saponified. No ligature and no blindfold present.

Under x-ray no internal parts were found. The head was squashed, although after reconstruction no particular feature of a gunshot was found, so I cannot find what was the origin of it. The head fractures may be occurred post or ante mortem.

Ribs and pelvis fractures may well have occurred post mortem from crushing or moving the body. Limbs (left humerus, right humerus, left femur) have particular multi-fragmented fractures. Although no metal fragments were seen, the nature and extent of the damage was suggestive of a high velocity rifle injury.

On external examination it was found, that the person was male. As established from anthropology data, he was aged between 31 and 71 years and estimated 182.0 +/- 7.7 cms in height. There were no particular identifying features.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 933B** was: **Unascertained**
