AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

SUMMARY:

This was a partly skeletonized and partly saponified body. It was complete except small bones from arms and legs were missing. Soft tissues were mainly missing and organs could not be identified.

From soft tissue determination the body was that of a male. According to anthropology measurements the sex was male, estimated height is 164.8 +/- 7.7 cm, and age range is 31 to 71 years. He was wearing two pairs of trousers, long underpants, a pair of socks and shoes. He also had a Koran in a trouser pocket.

In fluoroscopy, probable fragments were seen in neck and chest. In skull and cervical vertebrae were no other fractures, except in mandible where there was a part missing. They were also present in the chest and sites in the trunk.

In right ulna and radius were fractures which can be gunshot injuries.

According to findings it is possible that, in this case, there have been gunshot injuries in neck and chest, but these could not be ascertained.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 950B was:

Unascertained
