AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

CASE NO: KK3 951B **AUTOPSY DATE:** 09.09.99

MORTUARY: Visoko

SUMMARY:

Complete human remains, saponified, with cloth ligature around right wrist. Furthermore, a blindfold was found.

On external examination it was found that the person was male. As established from anthropology data, he was aged between 31 and 65, and measured 174.4 +/- 7.7 cms in height. There was no particular identifying features.

Rib fragments may well have occurred post mortem from moving or crushing the body. Three bullets were found around the multi-fragmented fracture of right humerus. This fracture was produced by a gunshot, but extent of damage suggests that the bullets had passed through something or someone else beforehand. He died, from a gunshot injury to the head. None of the fractures showed any clear bevelling but the nature and extent of the damage, and metal fragments, was certainly suggestive of a high velocity gunshot injury.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 951B was:

Gunshot injury to the head

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings
