**AUTOPSY REPORT**

**SUMMARY:**

This was a totally complete body. Some soft tissue was missing in arms and legs. According to soft tissue examination this was a male one. Hair was black and short, and he also has a beard and a moustache.

From anthropology measurements the height estimation was 178.9 +/- 7.7 cm and the age range 31-71 years.

In the chest area there were three whole bullets and fragments of one of them were outside the body on skin. In addition, there were two bullets in lumbar vertebrae. 12<sup>th</sup> thoracal and 11<sup>th</sup> lumbal vertebrae have fractures and there were probably ruptured internal organs in upper abdomen. Also there were fractures in both femurs.

He was wearing a shirt, trousers, socks and boots.

**CAUSE OF DEATH:**

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 969B** was:

**Gunshot injury in chest and abdomen**

**Gunshot injuries in both legs**

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.
