SUMMARY:

Complete human remains, partially skeletonized with large areas of well-preserved skin. Internal organs are decomposed, but present. There was a cloth ligature around both forearms, what suggests that the individual was tied up before death.

Although only tiny metal fragments were found in head, the cause of death was probably the gunshot injuries to the head (the nature of skull injuries suggests this). Metal parts found around the abdomen, and the hole containing some bowels present which prove that this individual was also shot in the abdomen. Furthermore, bullets were found within both femurs. There was also multi-fragmented fracture of the left femur. This shows that he was also shot in both legs. Ribs and clavicle fractures may well have occurred post mortem from crushing and/or moving the body.

On external examination it was found that this individual was male. As discovered from anthropology data, the person was male, aged 16-21, and measured 179.2 +/- 7.7 cms in height.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 974B was:

Gunshot injury to the head

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.
