AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

SUMMARY:

A complete human remains, saponified, no blindfold, but a ligature was found around the left wrist, which suggests that the person was tied up before his death. On external examination it was found that the person was male.

As established from anthropology data, age was between 31 – 71 years and measured 177.4 +/- 7.7 cms in height. An old, healed fracture of right clavicle has been found which could be a particular identifying feature.

The head is squashed, but the extent of the damage suggests post mortem crushing of the skull. Multiple rib and pelvic fractures may well have occurred post mortem from moving or crushing the body. Left tibia and left fibula are fractured, but it is impossible to say whether they occurred post mortem or ante mortem.

Furthermore a multi-fragment fracture of right femur and a copper bullet were found. These suggest a high velocity rifle injury. There were no other findings and so the cause of death on the person from this examination remains unascertained.
