**AUTOPSY REPORT**  
KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

**SUMMARY:**

Complete human remains, partially skeletonized. Neither ligature nor blindfold was found.

On external examination it was found that the person was male. As established from anthropology data, he was aged between 31 and 71, and measured 172.7 +/- 7.7 cms in height.

The nature and extent of skull fractures was certainly suggestive of a high velocity rifle injury. Multi-fragmented fracture of distal end of left femur may well have occurred from another high velocity rifle shot. Two bullets found around the proximal end of left femur and right tibia did not destroy the bones, so they had to have a low velocity. Furthermore, the metal plate was found in right tibia, which could be an identifying feature.

**CAUSE OF DEATH:**

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 977B** was:  
**Gunshot injury to the head**
