SUMMARY:

This was a partly skeletonized body. In trunk skin was also saponified. Body was complete. According to soft tissue, body was male one. Hair was brown and short and there was also a beard and moustache. From anthropology measurements the height estimation was 173.4 +/- 7.7 cm and the age range 31 – 65 years.

In the pelvic region, back right side, there was a round hole, which is a probable bullet entrance wound. In front, on abdomen, was a tear, approximately 4 cm in diameter, from which a part of small part of intestine was pushed out. It is suitable for exit wound. In shooting canal were fractures in 3-4 lumbar vertebrae.


In the skull in left parietal frontal bone was entrance exit wound and bone defect areas in right temporal and parietal sides. All skull bones were fractured. In addition there were a bullet in left chest and fractures in upper left costae and scapula.

In addition, in left ankle there were fragments of bullet, and fractures in tibia and fibula

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 980B** was:
Gunshot injuries in head, left chest, abdomen and left leg
