AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

SUMMARY:

A complete body with partial skeletonization in places but with a substantial amount of rather greasy soft tissue remaining elsewhere.

The person was male, and as established from anthropology data, was aged between 31 and 71, and measured from 157 to 172 cms in height. There were no particular identifying features.

He had been shot in the trunk, the bullet passing through the upper rim of the left side of the pelvis and lodging in the lower part of the right side of the back beneath the skin. There was an additional bullet injury to the right forearm where one of the bones was fractured, and possibly also to the right upper arm, fracturing the upper part of the humerus. The two may or may not have been related i.e. in the path of the same shot.

The only other injuries were fractured ribs on both sides of the chest, most likely post mortem in nature from crushing or moving the body after death.

The gunshot injury to the pelvis was certainly a potentially fatal one, the bullet likely to have passed through various vital structures. In the absence of damage elsewhere it was the probable cause of death. There were no other significant findings

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 984B** was: **Gunshot wound of pelvis**
