SUMMARY:

Complete human remains; almost completely saponified, with blindfold and ligature.

The holes on the dorsal and frontal surfaces of the chest were found with corresponding rib fractures. This suggests that the cause of death was gunshot injury to the chest. Furthermore, the multi-fragmented fractures of left humerus and left femur were found, the latter with "lead snowstorm" on x-ray. These fractures, by the nature and extent of the damage, were certainly suggestive of a high velocity rifle injury. The skull fractures have no particular features, so one cannot establish its origin.

On external examination it was found that this person was male. As established from anthropology data, the person was aged 31 – 60, and measured 178.0 +/- 7.7 cms in height.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 986B was:

Gunshot injury to the chest

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.
