SUMMARY:

This was partly skeletonized and saponified body. Body was complete. According to soft tissue determination it was male. From anthropology measurements height estimate was 182.5 +/- 7.7 cm and age range 13 – 16 years. Hair was black and short. He was wearing a T-shirt, long trousers, underwear and shoes. In underwear legs there was cutting in the bone at knees. He had blindfold.

In the left hip region was a bullet. In the right hip region was a hole in skin directed to left. In abdominal cavity were signs of intestinal rupture.

Findings indicate that in right hip region a shot had been directed from right to left. In addition there was a bullet hole in right humerus. A probable gunshot injury was also in right fibula, because there was bullet fragments in the same area.

There was also bone defect in mandibular, which might be gunshot injury. In neck and cervical vertebras were no injuries.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 987B was:

Gunshot injury in trunk, right humerus and fibula
