## **AUTOPSY REPORT**

## SUMMARY:

Complete human remains, saponified, with blindfold, but without any ligature.

On external examination it was found that the person was male. As established from anthropology data he was aged between 14 and 17 years, but the stature could not be found.

Multi-fragmented fracture of the skull was found. None of the fragments showed any clear bevelling and no metal fragments were seen, but the nature and extent of the damage was certainly suggestive of a high velocity rifle injury.

Rib fractures may well have occurred post mortem from moving, or crushing, the body. Left scapula fracture may have occurred from a rifle injury, but presumably the bullet has passed through something or someone else beforehand. Multi-fragmented fractures of right femur and left tibia were certainly suggestive of another high velocity rifle injuries.

## **CAUSE OF DEATH:**

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 990B was:

Gunshot injury to the head

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.
