AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

SUMMARY:

Complete human remains, partially saponified, partially skeletonized. Either blindfold or ligature was found.

On external examination it was found that this person was male. As established from anthropology data, he was aged between 14 and 16, and measured 171.3 +/- 7.7 cms in height. There were no particular identifying features.

Scapula and rib fractures may well have occurred post mortem from crushing or moving the body. Though no bones of the left lower limb were fractured, bullets were found in soft tissues of left lower limb. Presumably the bullets had passed through something or someone else beforehand.

There were no other findings and so the cause of death in this person, from this examination, remains unascertained.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 1014B was:

Unascertained
