AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

CASE NO: KK1 006B

AUTOPSY DATE: 09.08.99

SUMMARY:

A largely complete body but minus the right forearm, both hands, the lower jaw and a few vertebrae. The remains were completely skeletonized and disarticulated.

From anthropology data, the person was male, aged between 31 and 71, and measured from 162 to 177 cms in height. There were no particular identifying fractures.

He would appear to have died from a gunshot wound to the chest, with evidence of a bullet passing through it from side to side, entering probably on the right side where there was a defect in the 5th rib below the axilla, and exiting through the front of the left side, through the 3rd rib.

The only other injury was a fracture of the right shoulder blade, but this could have occurred post-mortem from crushing or moving the body.

There were no other findings

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK1 006B** was:
Gunshot injury to chest
