SUMMARY:

These were the almost completely skeletonized remains of a male adult.

The autopsy revealed extensive fractures of the facial bones and the remainder of the skull, consistent with the passage of a bullet through the head. From reconstructing the skull it would appear that the bullet had first struck the face and had passed through the head to exit from a bullet hole on the right side of the skull.

He had been hit by a further two bullets, one lodging in the pelvis and the other in the right thigh.

A ligature was found with the remains, but it was not obviously attached to the limbs.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK2 040B** was: **Bullet wounds of head and trunk**

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.
