AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

SUMMARY:

A complete skull, including the lower jaw, with the top two vertebrae and the bones of the throat also included. There were no soft tissues remaining, including the brain.

As established from anthropology examination, the remains were from an adult male, but it was not possible to be any more precise as regards age. The only potentially identifying features were that he had natural teeth in both jaws and appeared to have suffered a broken nose in the past, probably deviated to the right.

The skull itself was intact but there was a fracture of the right side of the lower jaw near the front. It was not possible, however, to say whether this occurred before or after death or be more precise as to its cause.

There were no other findings and so from this examination, it is not possible to determine the cause of death in this person.

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK2 097BP** was:
Unascertained
