## AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

### SUMMARY:

A portion of skull bone from the top of the head plus a lower jaw, whether or not from the same person. There were no soft tissues remaining.

From anthropology examination it was possible to say that the jaw, at least, was from an adult but not whether male or female. Apart from the person having natural teeth, there were no other identifying features.


The jaw was fractured on the left side but this could well have occurred after death from crushing or moving the body.

There were no other significant findings, and from this examination, it is not possible to determine the cause of death in this person.

### CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK2 110BP** was:
