SUMMARY:

This was a moderately well preserved and intact body of an adult male. Anthropological data would suggest that he was aged between 20 and 60 years.

He had been shot a number of times in the trunk and right leg. One bullet was recovered from the chest while another had penetrated the abdominal cavity from where it was retrieved at autopsy. A portion of bullet was also found adjacent to the pelvis. The right thighbone had also been shattered by the passage of a bullet through the leg.

The facial skeleton was badly fractured but it was not possible to determine if these injuries had been sustained before or after death.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK2 114B was:

Bullet wounds of trunk and right leg.

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.
