SUMMARY:

This was the body of an adult male. The body was badly decomposed and partially skeletonized with the head having completely separated from the remainder of the body.

Death was due to bullet wounds of the head and trunk. A bullet had struck the right side of the head and had passed forwards into the bones of the face where it had fragmented. A further bullet was recovered from the chest whilst a third had gone through the left half of the pelvis.

There was evidence that the hands had been bound together with a ligature.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK2 116B** was: **Bullet wounds of head and trunk**

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.
