



**AUTOPSY REPORT**  
KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

**SUMMARY:**

The upper half of a body – the chest and upper arms – but minus the head. The remains were still in clothing and there was dried tissue adherent to many of the bones.

From anthropology examination, the person was adult, aged between 31 and 60, but it was not possible to say whether male or female or to determine anything further.

There were fractured ribs on both sides of the chest and a fracture of the right shoulder blade, but most likely these occurred after death from crushing or moving the body. There was also fragmentation of a number of vertebrae in the spine but it was not possible to say when these occurred i.e. whether before or after death.

From this examination, it is not possible to determine the cause of death in this person.

**CAUSE OF DEATH:**

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK2 127BP** was:  
**Unascertained**
