



## AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

### SUMMARY:

The upper part of a body i.e. chest and left upper arm, but minus the skull. The remains were partly skeletonized, but with a substantial amount of both dry and moist soft tissue still present.

From anthropology examination, the person was aged between 31 and 65, but it was not possible to say whether male or female or to determine anything further.

There were fractures of the ribs on both sides of the chest and of both shoulder blades, but most likely these occurred after death from crushing or moving the body.

There were no other significant findings, and so from this examination, it is not possible to determine the cause of death in this person.

### CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK2 129BP** was:  
**Unascertained**
