SUMMARY:

An isolated lower jaw with a single neck bone and a portion of base of skull also included, whether or not all from the same person.

From anthropology examination the jaw came from a young person, someone aged between 15 and 19, but it was not possible to say whether male or female. There was a partly healed comminuted fracture to the left of the midline, the bone being in several small pieces with a fine piece of wire joining three of them together. Clearly this was an injury which had occurred some weeks or months earlier and been surgically treated.

There were no other injuries, fresh or old, and from this examination, it is not possible to determine the cause of death in this person.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 006BP** was:

Unascertained
