AUTOPSY REPORT

SUMMARY:

Bones from the legs – the whole of the right leg and foot and the thigh bone from the left leg. They were completely skeletonized, with no soft tissue remaining.

From anthropology estimation, they were from an adult person, i.e. someone over 17, but it was not possible to say whether male or female. He or she measured from 165 to 181 cms in height, but there were no other identifying features.

There was a fracture of the middle third of the left femur but the lower part of the bone was missing so it was difficult to say what caused this or whether it occurred before or after death.

The other leg was uninjured and so, from this examination, it is not possible to determine the cause of death in this person.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 016BP** was:
Unascertained
