SUMMARY:

A collection of bones – pieces of skull, a right shoulder blade and a left forearm – whether or not all from the same person.

From anthropology examination they were from an adult i.e. over 17, but it was not possible to say whether male or female.

The skull was extensively fractured but as much of it was missing, it was not possible to say what caused this or wether it occurred before or after death. In the pieces remaining there were no obvious gunshot defects. The shoulder blade was also fractured but this is likely to have occurred after death from crushing or moving the body.

There were no other findings and so from this examination, it is not possible to determine the cause of death in this person.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 089BP** was: **Unascertained**
