AUTOPSY REPORT

SUMMARY:

Most of the upper half of a body minus the head and pelvis but including the arms. There were an additional three bones from the right hand of another person mixed in. There was still some greasy soft tissue present in the trunk but elsewhere the remains were skeletonized.

As established from anthropology data the person was an adult, aged over 31, but it was not possible to say whether male or female, or to determine anything further.

There were fractures of many of the ribs on both sides of the chest but most likely these occurred after death from crushing or moving the body. There were no other injuries.

The only other finding was a ligature around the left forearm, made of nylon string.

From this examination, it is not possible to determine the cause of death in this person.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 095BP** was:
Unascertained
