SUMMARY:

Two bones from a left arm – the humerus and the ulna – with no soft tissues remaining.

From anthropology examination, the bones were from an adult i.e. someone aged over 17, but it was not possible to say whether male or female. He or she must have had a withered arm, the forearm bone being congenitally shortened and curved, and the upper arm bone correspondingly thin from lack of use.

The humerus was fractured and the upper end missing, but it was not possible to say what caused this or whether it occurred before or after death.

The only other finding was a possible ligature with the remains, made of a strip of white cloth.

From this examination, it is not possible to determine the cause of death in this person.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 104BP** was:

Unascertained
