**AUTOPSY REPORT**  
KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

**SUMMARY:**

A complete body minus only the left foot. There was a substantial amount of soft tissue present. The internal organs were still present, but they were in a state of advanced decomposition.

As estimated from the anthropological data the remains were from a male adult, aged between 35 and 65 years and measured from 160 to 175 cm (mean: 167 cm) in height. He had grey short hair.

The skull showed a gunshot entry wound to the left side in the temporal os, and an exit wound in the anterior aspect of the right parietal os. There also was a fracture of the left 11<sup>th</sup> rib near the spine. Some small metal fragments of a bullet were lying in the soft tissues of the lower part of the left half of the thorax.

The fractures of multiple ribs of the right thoracic half as well as of the right fibula probably were caused post mortem. There were no other injuries nor other findings.

The man died from the 2 gunshot injuries he received.

**CAUSE OF DEATH:**

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 105B** was:  
**Gunshot wound to the head**
