## AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

### SUMMARY:

A skull including the lower jaw and the top bone of the neck, but with part of the same neck bone from another person mixed in.

As established from anthropology examination, the skull was from an adult male, but it was not possible to be any more precise as regards age or to determine anything further.

There were fractures of both sides of the skull and of the face, with portions of bone missing. It was difficult to say however, what caused these or whether they occurred before or after death. None of the fractures showed any typical gunshot defects.

There were no other findings and so from this examination, it is not possible to determine the cause of death in this person.

### CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 109BP** was:  
**Unascertained**
