**AUTOPSY REPORT**  
KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

**SUMMARY:**

Almost entire body; skeletonized, all the bones except some bone fragments of the skull, few bones of right foot and hand were present. Hardly any soft tissue is remaining.

The sex is determined as male, stature estimated as 178. +/- 7.7 cm, and age estimated as 31-~~80~~ years by anthropological data. No other specific features for identification observed.

A fatal high velocity firearm (bullet) injury in the pelvic region with the possible entry wound in the back. The rib fractures and fractured vertebral body are inconclusive with regard to their causation and as to whether they are ante or post mortem injuries. The comminuted fracture of the skull did not show sufficient evidence to arrive at a conclusion regarding exact cause and whether it is ante or post mortem injury.

**CAUSE OF DEATH:**

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 110B** was:  
**Firearm injury to the trunk**
