**AUTOPSY REPORT**  
KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

**SUMMARY:**

An almost complete body minus two ribs of each side and the left foot. There still was some adipoceros soft tissue adherent to the trunk and the limbs

As estimated from anthropological data, the person was male, aged between 31 and 71 years and measured from 160 to 175 cm (mean:168 cm) in height. There were no particular identifying features

He had been shot in the right upper part of the back, as seen by a comminuted fracture of the right scapula and a bullet, which was lodged in the soft tissue of the right humerus near the shoulder. Although with such a gunshot injury it is highly likely, that there would have been associated internal damage or complications, this cannot be definitely proved and so the cause of death must remain unascertained

There were no other injuries nor other findings

**CAUSE OF DEATH:**

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 133B** was:  
**Unascertained**
