An almost complete body with few bones of both hands missing. A substantial amount of adipocerous soft tissue was still present. The brain and the internal organs of the thorax were still inside the body.

The person was male as judged from soft tissue evidence, and as estimated from anthropological data was aged between 30 and 60 years and measured from 160 to 175 cm mean: 168 cm) in height. There were no particular identifying features.

The man had been shot in the head. The midface was shattered and there was a gunshot exit wound in the forehead. The wound was consistent with a high velocity gunshot injury.

The fractures of the right clavicle as well as of the right fibula probably were caused by post mortem trauma.

There were no other injuries nor other findings.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 143B was:

Gunshot wound to the head

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.
