## SUMMARY:

The fragmented portions of a skull minus the lower jaw, together with two bones from a left hand.

As established from anthropology examination, the person was male and adult, though it was not possible to be any more precise as regards age or to determine anything further.

The skull was extensively fractured, with several pieces missing. No obvious gunshot defects were seen in the parts remaining, and it is therefore difficult to say what caused the damage or whether it occurred before or after death.

There were no other findings and from this examination, it is not possible to establish the cause of death in this person.

## **CAUSE OF DEATH:**

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 160BP was:

Unascertained
